### 10512NAT Graduate Certificate in Wound Management

#### Course Description

The Australian Nursing and Midwifery Education Centre in partnership with key wound management specialists have joined together to deliver a contemporary and nationally recognised Graduate Certificate in Wound Management qualification. The training incorporates the Australian Wound Management Associations' *Standards for Wound Management* and utilises evidence based practice to ensure learners develop expert skills and knowledge in wound management.

All training and assessment materials have been developed by The William Light Institute.

#### Benefits for students

Students will acquire knowledge and skills which include, but are not limited to:

- Assessment, care planning and documentation skills related to specialised or advanced wound management;
- Clinical skills and interventions required for specialised or advanced wound management;
- Wound management and healing evaluation skills;
- Wound management resource development skills;
- Wound management research skills.

Access to leading clinical wound specialists with extensive and current experience in wound management across diverse health settings.

#### Applicant entry requirements

- An **Advanced Diploma of Enrolled Nursing**  
Or
- An undergraduate degree in **Registered Nursing, Podiatry, Physiotherapy** or other **Medical Officer**

And

- Evidence of current registration with one of the following professional regulatory boards, through the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency:
  - Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia
  - Podiatry Board of Australia
  - Physiotherapy Board of Australia
  - Medical Board of Australia

#### Structured Compulsory Workshops

Learners will be required to attend two clinical workshops during the course (based in Adelaide). The workshops will involve both training and assessment. **Attendance is mandatory.** Dates to be confirmed.

#### Special Requirements

Access to a clinical workplace that provides patient wound management.

#### Career Pathways

On successful completion of this course, the graduate will be issued with a certificate. Should a graduate not complete the course in its entirety, they will receive a statement of attainment listing the completed units of competency. This qualification does not provide any other exit points to other qualifications.

After achieving this qualification candidates may undertake:

- A variety of Graduate Diplomas related to health care.

Students are encouraged to commit to lifelong learning through Continuing Professional Development (CPD) and other learning to maintain currency for their employment.

#### Length of Course:

1 Year - part time

#### Study Format:

Online delivery – with two compulsory attendance 2 day workshops. (One per semester)
